#### The Reading

*adaptation of Acts 10:34-43*

Then Peter spoke to the people and said: "God does not play favorites! It does not matter to God who you are or where you are from—if you want God and are ready to follow God, the door is open. You know the message God sent to the children of Israel, preaching peace by Jesus Christ; Jesus is Lord of all! You know what happened in Israel, beginning in Galilee with John the Baptist: how Jesus arrived from Nazareth and was blessed by God with the Holy Spirit and power; how Jesus went everywhere doing good and healing everyone who was beaten down by the Devil. Jesus was able to do all this because God was with him. And we saw it all, everything Jesus did in Israel and in Jerusalem. The Romans killed Jesus; they hung him on a cross, where he died. But three days later, Jesus rose from the dead—alive! After He came back from the dead, we saw Jesus; he talked with us; we ate and drank with Him. Jesus commanded us to tell this to everyone, and we proclaim that Jesus is the one whom God has made the judge of the living and dead. Everyone who believes in Jesus receives forgiveness of sins through his name."
